


I am Resurrection and I am Life, says the Lord. Even in death, anyone who believes in, shall not die for ever.

The Liturgy of the Word

A Reading from Hebrew Scripture

Isaiah 6: 1-8

Lector: A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. 

The Great Thanksgiving Eucharistic Prayer A Preparation of the Altar

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Bishop: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Bishop: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord; who rose victorious from the dead, and comforts us with the blessed hope of everlasting life. For to your faithful people, O Lord, life is changed, not ended; and when our mortal body lies in death, there is prepared for us a dwelling place eternal in the heavens. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Bishop and People:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the Cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Bishop and People:

The Bishop continues:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with St. Timothy, St. Edmund, St. Paul and all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.** +

The Fraction

Bishop: God of promise, you have prepared a banquet for us;

People: Happy are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb.

Receiving Holy Communion

- **Children:** All children are invited to the Communion Rail to receive a blessing. Those who have been baptized are welcome to receive the Sacrament at parental discretion.
- **Baptized Adults:** All baptized Christians are invited to receive the Sacrament as personal conscience permits. Those who do not wish to receive may cross their arms over their chests to receive a blessing.
- **How?** Extend your hands (tradition places the right palm over the left) to receive the Bread. Consume the Bread (or wait for the Chalice Bearer to take the Bread from your hand and dip it into the Chalice, placing the Sacrament upon your tongue). Assist the Chalice Bearer in quiding the Chalice to your lips.
- **Physically limited?** If you are unable to walk to Communion, speak to an Usher, and the Sacrament will be brought to you in your pew.
- For those allergic to wheat products: Gluten free wafers are available. Please mention this to an Usher if you might so benefit.







Post-Communion Prayer - Please stand

Celebrant:

Almighty God, we thank you that in your great love you have fed us with the spiritual food and drink of the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and have given us a foretaste of your heavenly banquet. Grant that this Sacrament may be to us a comfort in affliction, and a pledge of our inheritance in that kingdom where there is no death, neither sorrow nor crying, but the fullness of joy with all your saints; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

The Commendation - All stand

Bishop:

Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,

People: Where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting. Bishop:

You only are immortal, the creator and maker of humankind; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return. Bishop:



So then, we do not lose heart.

Bound in God, bound to us, bound in peace and hope and love, You shall not lose heart; we shall not lose heart.
