
Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

In the gospel lesson Jesus tells his disciples of faith's great power, and reminds them that servants must not expect special privileges or thanks merely for doing their duty. The first saying forcefully stresses the realization that faith's strength-even the power of a little faith-ought never be underestimated. The story about the hardworking servant and the master makes the point that humans can never hold any claim over God and put God in their debt. For Jesus' followers there is no room for boasting or self-righteousness because of their faith and service.

A Reading from Hebrew Scripture

Habakkuk 1:1-4, 2:1-4

An Introduction:

In the first reading the prophet bitterly complains to the Lord about the injustice and violence in the world. God answers that justice will come in time; meanwhile, the righteous will live by faithfulness and loyalty. It is the time of the Chaldean (or Babylonian) invasion. Habakkuk cannot understand how God can allow all this evil and destruction. He takes his position in the watchtower to await the Lord's reply. Those who are right with God will continue to live by their trust in God.

Lector: A reading from the Book of Habakkuk

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw.

O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?

Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save?

Why do you make me see wrong-doing and look at trouble?

Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.

So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails.

The wicked surround the righteous-therefore judgment comes forth perverted.

I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart;

I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint.

Then the LORD answered me and said:

Write the vision;

make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it.

For there is still a vision for the appointed time;

it speaks of the end, and does not lie.

If it seems to tarry, wait for it;

it will surely come, it will not delay.

Look at the proud!

Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faith.

Psalm 37 Noli aemulari

A psalm of advice to the wise, instructing them to avoid evil and to wait patiently on the Lord in righteousness. The Lord will cut off the wicked.

- **1** Do not fret yourself because of evildoers; * do not be jealous of those who do wrong.
- 2 For they shall soon wither like the grass, * and like the green grass fade away.
- **3** Put your trust in the LORD and do good; * dwell in the land and feed on its riches.
- 4 Take delight in the LORD, * and he shall give you your heart's desire.
- **5** Commit your way to the LORD and put your trust in him, * and he will bring it to pass.
- 6 He will make your righteousness as clear as the light * and your just dealing as the noonday.

- 8 Do not fret yourself over the one who prospers, * the one who succeeds in evil schemes.
- **9** Refrain from anger, leave rage alone; * do not fret yourself; it leads only to evil.

The Epistle Lesson 2 Timothy 1:1-14

An Introduction:

This passage is the opening letter of Paul to his friend and coworker Timothy, whom he keeps always in his prayers. Paul is keen to see in Timothy the rekindling of the gift of faith. He prays that he will grow into a mature understanding of the gospel revealed in Jesus, quickened by the indwelling Holy Spirit. Timothy was the son of a Jewish mother and a Gentile father who became a companion of Paul's at a relatively young age.

Lector: A reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I am grateful to God-- whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did-- when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me,

in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

Because you are always more ready to hear than we to pray, stir our minds and hearts to intercession that we may receive the abundance of your mercy beyond all that we desire or deserve:

Put your trust in the Lord and do good.

Rekindle charity and every spiritual gift within your Church, O God, remembering the Diocese of Mexico and this parish of St. Paul's, for you have not given us a spirit of cowardice, but rather of power and of love and of self-discipline:

Take delight in the Lord, and you shall find your heart's desire!

Bless and strengthen the labors of this parish church and all our ministries that your own good purpose might here be seen:

Commit your ways to the Lord and put your trust in God alone.

Quicken us in service to the downtrodden and those suffering from any oppression that we might do what ought to be done for their care and well-being:

Commit your ways to the Lord and God will bring it to pass.

Remember our sick Lord Christ, and especially those for whom are prayers are now offered (the people may offer their petitions). Soothe the dying, bind up the broken-hearted, and give us confidence in the life and immortality brought to light through the Gospel:

Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for God.

Increase our faith even to the size of a mustard seed that we might give ourselves to the holy calling with which we have been called, with the help of the indwelling Spirit:

Your righteousness will be clear as the light, your just dealing as noonday!

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the Cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." + Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with St. Michael Archangel, St. Paul, and all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.** +

Celebrant: God of promise, you have prepared a banquet for us.

People: Happy are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb.

Receiving Holy Communion

- **Children:** All children are invited to the Communion Rail to receive a blessing. Those who have been baptized are welcome to receive the Sacrament at parental discretion.
- **Baptized Adults:** All baptized Christians are invited to receive the Sacrament as personal conscience permits. Those who do not wish to receive may cross their arms over their chests to receive a blessing.
- **How?** Extend your hands (tradition places the right palm over the left) to receive the Host. The Sacrament is valid in one kind (the Host alone).
- Receiving the Chalice: Should you wish to receive from the common Chalice, consume the Bread (or wait for the Chalice Bearer to take the Bread from your hand and dip it into the Chalice, placing the Sacrament upon your tongue). Assist the Chalice Bearer in guiding the Chalice to your lips.
- Intinction: St. Paul's does not allow for the communicant to dip his or her own Host in the Chalice for sanitary reasons.
- **Physically limited?** If you are unable to walk to Communion, speak to an Usher, and the Sacrament will be brought to you in your pew.
- For those allergic to wheat products: Gluten free wafers are available. Please mention this to an Usher if you might so benefit.

Please remember St. Paul's in your Will, Trust and Estate Planning (the Book of Common Prayer page 445). Estates in the U.S. are uncomplicated. Gifts of property within Mexico must be designated to Amigos Anglicanos A.C. (rather than St. Paul's Asociación Religiosa) to avoid intrusion on gifts of real estate by the Mexican government.
